Editor's Note



Is it naïve to suggest the ugly cloud of the pandemic that sent us scrambling to our screens to showcase and judge future generations of young virtuosi is finally lifting?

Perhaps. But it is safe to say, relative to the last two years, 2022 is looking pretty solid for international competitions or, at least, for predicting and solidifying their information (with the caveat that it's always best to consult their websites directly for updates). Scrolling through the near-100 listings here, you'll find quite a few application deadlines looming in the not-too-distant future, along with live/streamed semi-final and final-round dates (valid

as of February 1) in locations ranging from Ljubljana, Slovenia, to Cork, Ireland, to Flint, MI.

As always, the variety of disciplines, genres, prizes, eligibility, frequency, and judging criteria is vast. One of the most prestigious competitions in the U.S., whose format varies one year to the next, is putting the classical saxophone forward—a first in the Naumburg Competition's 50-year history. The quadrennial Van Cliburn International Piano Competition arrives in June, ten days of finals and semi-finals open to the public as well as streamed from Bass Hall in Fort Worth, TX. That application deadline has already passed, of course, but contenders have until March 31 to apply for the ARD International Music Competition, which this year focusses on piano, trombone, flute, or string quartet and takes place next September in Munich. Even farther down the road—and perhaps with a more limited applicant pool—is the biennial International Percussion Competition, the deadline for which is October 2023, with semi-finals and finals scheduled for the following April at the Shanghai Conservatory of Music.

With titles honoring composers from Wilhelm Stenhammar to Franz Liszt to Toru Takemitsu and performers from Lotte Lenya to Sir Georg Solti to Artur Rubinstein, these competitions represent some of the most prestigious in the world. The stakes are high, the challenges vast. But the rewards—monetary, professional, and just knowing you tried for your personal best—are huge, not just for the participants, but for a field that celebrates constant rejuvenation.
