Editor's Note



I shared an elevator recently with my next-door neighbor's young daughter. She wore a T-shirt with her favorite basketball player emblazoned on the front; it brought to mind a recent email from the Cliburn Foundation selling one with an image of 2022 Van Cliburn International Piano Competition winner, Yunchan Lim, in a dramatic mid-performance close-up.

We all have our heroes, and that's the point: of all efforts by music organizations to reach out and truly engage with a larger audience, perhaps none has as much potential as the

competition. This is why so many of those listed in the 2023 *Guide to Top Competitions* have opened their live rounds, either in person or via livestream.

There is a real parallel between competing in the concert hall and competing in sports, in how the drama of the competition seizes our attention. It is the human element of performing with the most potential to attract non-aficionados, so why not use it as a drawing point?

Yunchan Lim is a star, but watching him progress to that status was far more intriguing than simply learning he had won. Witnessing 24 or so young contenders jump through the requisite hoops to achieve stardom, an observer can't help but become invested, root for his or her favorite, cheer the underdog, boo the judges, etc. The more we watch the human struggle, the more invested we become in the process, in the competition, in the art form. The T-shirt takes that investment one step farther, a marketing tactic not just for the champion but for the event that made him so and for the artform over which he has triumphed.

On a technical note, you'll see that dates of this year's *Competitions Guide* are reflective of the near two-year pause caused by the pandemic. In some cases, such as the Schoenfeld International String Competition in Los Angeles, the deadline for applications has passed, and the judges have already made their choices (and notified them). But the live rounds, both semis and finals, have yet to take place. Blame the long break in the timeline on the pandemic. We are still making strides to recover.
