





Editor's Note



Ah, youth. In assessing differences and similarities among the entries in our 2024 Competition Guide, I have found a huge range of frequencies (from annual to quintennial), locales (NYC to Tokyo to Sydney), disciplines (voice to violin to tuba), and prize monies (none to a hundred thousand or more). But there is a common thread among all: Youth. While there may be a minimum age for eligibility, there is always a maximum, and it is generally between 30 and 32 years.

There's nothing particularly wrong with this—after all, "young artist" is a phrase that can generate a particular kind of excitement, signifying potential to spare and promise to realize—but it does beg the question: What about everybody else? While it's true that (only) amateurs 35 and over are invited to compete in the Van Cliburn Amateur Piano Competition, what about the 42-year-old mid-career performer? Is it just too late for him or her to be recognized for their talents?

Fortunately, there is a category in which youth, or lack of it, is less of an issue. Out of the six composing competitions in this Guide, four are open to any age. (After all, the esteemed Elliott Carter was still writing the morning of the day he died, at 103; John Williams, 91, is still at it.) Among our listings, the American Guild of Organists and ECS Publishing host a biennial competition open to any age that seeks the best SATB work for chorus and organ (AGO/ECS Publishing Award); the Azrieli Music Prizes are open to composers of "all ages, genders, faiths, backgrounds, and levels of experience," and they even throw in travel expenses and waive the entry fee. The Barlow Endowment offers a \$15,000 commission for a new organ work and it, too, is open any age, gender, race, or even political persuasion. The winning piece is performed by a consortium of performers. The National Association of Teachers of Singing (NATS) has an art song composition award for an English text setting (for which the composer has secured the rights) written by "any" composer. The Holiday Carol Commission Competition and the Toru
Takemitsu Composition Award both have a 35 and under requirement and offer performances and cash rewards.

Perhaps the time has come to create a new, all-ages-eligible event seeking the best pianist, string player, brass quintet, etc. As the age of the population rises, shouldn't the arts-competition-eligibility age rise as well?




