





Editor's Note



What's your summer music craving—opera in the Swiss Alps? Perhaps it's chamber music in a California vineyard or prepared piano at a Massachusetts modern art museum? Such is a sampling from the menu of options in our sixth annual Guide to Summer Festivals—at nearly 100 entries, it's our largest yet, and certainly the most entertaining to peruse.

Just a few highlights: A new production of the Mozart Requiem at the Aix-en-Provence Festival; the "Loud Weekend" at Bang on a Can's annual Festival at Mass MOCA in the Berkshires; the world premiere of Poul Ruders's *The Thirteenth Child* at Santa Fe Opera, where

the stage is often open to a view of the sun setting amid the Jemez Mountain range; pianist Yuja Wang (Musical America's 2017 Artist of the Year) performing in Croatia at the Dubrovnik Summer Festival; Fabio Luisi conducting Beethoven's Sixth Symphony in Tuscany, at the Chigiana International Festival; the Pacifica Quartet in a Napa Valley winery at Music in the Vineyards; Handel's *Ariodante* at the Drottningholms Slottsteater in Switzerland. Opera in the Ozarks, in Eureka Springs, AR, has Mark Adamo's *Little Women* on the docket; while the Mark Morris Dance Group will premiere a new work set to Erik Satie's *Sports et divertissements* at Mostly Mozart in New York. Also, as proof that there is no spot on earth too remote for live music of any sort to thrive, the 22nd annual Orcas Island Chamber Music Festival, in the San Juan Islands off the coast of Washington, will present Susan Graham in recital while the Miró Quartet will give the world premiere of Pulitzer Prize-winning composer Kevin Puts's latest opus.

And they say the season slows down in summer.

BARD MUSIC FESTIVAL/BARD SUMMERSCAPE

FESTIVAL HIGHLIGHTS

In 2019, its 30th-anniversary year, the Bard Music Festival will explore the life, work, and legacy of Erich Wolfgang Korngold (1897–1957), the last great exponent of the vocabulary of late Romanticism, whose career is the mirror image of the peculiar trajectory of 20th-century music. Highlights include a semi-staged performance of Korngold's Die tote Stadt; a program of music for film centered around The Adventures of Robin Hood, featuring works by Max Steiner, Franz Waxman, Bernard Herrmann, and Alfred Newman; and a look at America through operettas from the early 20th century. The Festival will open with an all-Korngold program, surveying his work beginning with *Der Schneemann*, through scores connected to his career in Hollywood. Programs will highlight the work of teachers and admirers; influences of popular music; development of the film musical; and music written during and after World War II. Audience will have the rare opportunity to hear Korngold's Piano Concerto for the Left Hand, Op. 17 (performed by Orion Weiss), as well as his majestic Symphony, Op. 40, among other works. Orchestral forces include the American Symphony Orchestra (ASO) and The Orchestra Now, conducted by Leon Botstein.

Botstein conducts the ASO in the U.S. premiere of Korngold's 1927 opera *The Miracle of Heliane* (*Das Wunder der Heliane*) in a new production directed by Christian Räth with sets and costumes by Esther Bialas. The cast includes Lithuanian soprano Ausrine Stundyte in a rare U.S. appearance, and rising star tenor Daniel Brenna. SummerScape also presents *Acquanetta*, a music-theater work composed by Michael Gordon

with libretto by Deborah Artman and directed by Daniel Fish. The festival opens with Grace & Mercy by choreographer Ronald K. Brown, featuring an original score created and performed by Meshell Ndegeocello, alongside live performances by Jennifer Holliday and Peven Everett.






