Editor's Note



For the 2025 Musical America Guide to Festivals, we asked each of those listed (117 this year) to tell us about the coming season's highlights. It's interesting to compare and contrast their responses; some emphasize artists' names, some repertoire, some both—and some just the basics: "Come and listen to your classical music faves amid nature's most enchanting landscapes..."

To be fair, we are asking very early in the "confirmed bookings" calendar (the first questionnaires went out in February), so not everybody can respond with specifics, but there

are some hints as to the new and unusual. Take, for instance, the Cabrillo Festival, whose orchestral offerings include three world premieres and a co-commission by Jake Heggie, all in honor of the 50th anniversary of LGBTQ Pride in the event's hometown of Santa Cruz, CA. New York's TIME:SPANS Festival also hones in on strictly 21st-century repertoire, not so much for Cabrillo's orchestras as for smaller-scaled specialists, such as Talea Ensemble, Claire Chase, and the JACK Quartet. Chase, whose instrument is flute but whose musical imagination has duly impressed the MacArthur "genius" honchos, also oversees the Ojai Music Festival this year, another paradise for fans of cutting-edge fare. In this case, if the repertoire isn't new, the interpretations will be. "Performers of diverse musical backgrounds will meet in unpredictable and electrifying ways," organizers promise. Chase calls her gathering of collaborators a "meta ensemble."

Broader-spectrum festivals, such as Aspen, mix the old and new, the latter represented by the world premiere of *Siddhartha, She*, by Christopher Theofanidis and Melissa Studdard, described as "a theatrical oratorio" loosely based on Herman Hesse's novel of the same name. Another opera getting its premiere among more standard fare, at the Festival d'Aix-en-Provence, is *The Nine Jewelled Deer* with director Peter Sellars overseeing a collaboration between electronics composer Sivan Eldar and South Indian singer-improviser Ganavya Doraiswamy. And somewhere between Strauss's *Die Fledermaus* and Donizetti's *Don Pasquale* at the Opera Theater of St. Louis will be the world premiere of *This House* by Ricky lan Gordon, Lynn Nottage, and Ruby Aiyo Gerber, where "hidden truths about a family's legacy come to light."

From opera to chamber music, newly wrought or realized, the coming months hold as much musical spark and ingenuity as they ever have—a welcome sign of hope in a troubling time.



FESTIVAL HIGHLIGHTS

The Fisher Center at Bard presents SummerScape 2025 in New York's idyllic Hudson Valley. In two weekends of themed concerts and panels, the 35th Bard Music Festival offers an intensive reexamination of "Martinů and His World" (August 8-17), complemented by the first fully staged American production of *Dalibor*, a rarely heard opera by Martinů's Czech compatriot Smetana (July 25-August 3). 


